PW was worried about the treatment which would be accorded Pew in Japan should they be returned after the war. He did not think the Authoritical would go so fer as to dill them, but they might be deprived of certain right; They would cortainly be looked down on and might find it impossible to earn a living. He hoped that it might be possible for them to find employment in Australia.

He expressed the hope that after the war all Governments would cooperato, perticularly as regards the treatment and repatriation of PsW. On
being told that the overthrow of Japanese militarists was a sine qua non,
PW said that he hoped a change of Government in Japan would solve the difficulty. PW asked if he would continue to be fed, and if he would be allowed
to work and be paid while a PW. He would like to acquire a knowledge of
elementary English.

Social Life

PW stated that there were two brothels to his knowledge in RARAUL They contained a total of about 100 Korean and Japanese girls.
