

He promised to pay me 25 yen a month but he did not ever actually pay me at all. Again I repeat that every time I asked SHINOHARA to let me quit he threatened me and told me that I could not leave. He said that if I did leave I would be punished because I was working for the highest Japanese officers on the island."

(g) Witness:

Nicolasa P. Mendiola.

Location:

Tutujan, Guam.

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Has testified that: "Some time in 1942, SHINOHARA came up to my house in Anigua and offered me clothes, money and everything that I wish if I would work at a whorehouse in Piti. I told him that I do not want to work in a whorehouse. I told him that I have children to attend to but he insisted that I come along anyway and look the place over. Then I got in the car and rode with him to Piti. Upon arrival at the house which Ozone was conducting he told me to get in there and work with the rest of the girls. Again I refused and told him that I do not like the place. He insisted that I stay in this house for two or three days and see how I like it. Again I refused and then he finally admitted me to the car again and took me to Agana, after I made the excuse that I will work provided I could go back and get some new clothes. Before I got done on this trip SHINOHARA said: "You better work or else we'll put you to work anyway." Then, three weeks later, Mr. SHINOHARA came back to my house and asked me to work at the officers' bar at Piti. I asked him what the work is going to be and he told me that it is going to be just like a restaurant and a bar in American times. Then I agreed to work and that same day he took me to the hospital and had me shot and examined by a medical officer. The next day, after being informed that I was not suffering from any venereal disease, SHINOHARA told me to report myself at the former agricultural station (used by Japanese as a brothel) and start working. After two days in this place I asked Mr. Ozone to quit and he informed me that I cannot leave the place any more. The third day a Japanese officer came and we served him with drinks. Then the officer asked me to come into the room and we had sexual intercourse that night. I stayed there three months. During all the time that I was working for them there, Mr. SHINOHARA occasionally brought up Japanese officers for us. The first time SHINOHARA approached me he told me that if I did not work in the whorehouse I would be locked up. I was afraid at this time because SHINOHARA was accompanied by some naval enlisted men who carried bayonets."

(l) Witness:

J. M. Flores.

Location:

Agana, Guam.

Has testified that: "One morning in 1943, I, as a member of the Kyowakai, like the other members of the same organization, was asked to participate in this parade. As far as I remember the parade assembled and started from the Plaza and went all around the city where the Catholic procession usually passes through and ended in the Plaza where it started. There are two features worth mentioning regarding this parade. One was an open backed automobile with a man with an open coat, supposedly ex-Governor MacMillin, with a Japanese soldier who really was Gil Shinohara, son of the accused, with fixed bayonet facing the supposed Governor. On the floor of the automobile I saw the American flag on which SHINOHARA was standing. The other feature was a horse draped with an American flag. I saw the stars and the blue of the flag as it was the most noticeable. The horse was supposed to be owned by Mr. T. SHINOHARA who was active in this parade."
