



## **Terms and Conditions for using the “Map of ‘Comfort Stations’ of the Japanese Military” (paid version)**

The “Map of ‘comfort stations’ of the Japanese military” (hereinafter referred to as the Map) was produced by the Women’s Active Museum on War and Peace (WAM) based on intensive research of documents, including survivors’ testimonies, soldiers’ testimonies/memoirs, eyewitness reports, and official documents. While the print version of the Map (¥110/copy) is sold at WAM, we also provide two types of digital files of the Map image: a free version with low resolution and a paid version with high resolution. When applying for the paid version, please follow the terms and conditions below.

1. There are four different versions of the Map image that can be provided as shown in Appendix 1. Please see Appendix 2 for cases in which use is not permitted due to copyright protection, prevention of alteration, etc.
2. The fee is JPY 11,000. If you require an invoice, please contact WAM (please note that we only accept the payment via PayPal from abroad).
3. Use of the Map image is limited to one time and one medium for one fee. You may not share the provided Map image with any other organization or individual. If you’d like to use it for another purpose or medium, please submit a new request form.
4. The Map image may only be used as provided. Any revision, alteration or trimming of the provided image is prohibited. The credit (© Women's Active Museum on War and Peace (WAM)) should be legible (e.g. if the text is too small to read, it should be written outside the Map image as a caption).
5. When adding explanations to the Map image, please ensure that they do not deviate from the outline stated in the ‘Introduction’ of the “Map of ‘Comfort Stations’ of the Japanese Military” website.
6. A printed copy or data file of your material containing the Map image should be provided to WAM for our records. Please send us the URL if you use it online.
7. We publish on our website a list of how the Map image is used. We will publish your name, affiliation, and how you use the Map (e.g., for a presentation, book publication, etc.). Please contact us if this is inconvenient for you.

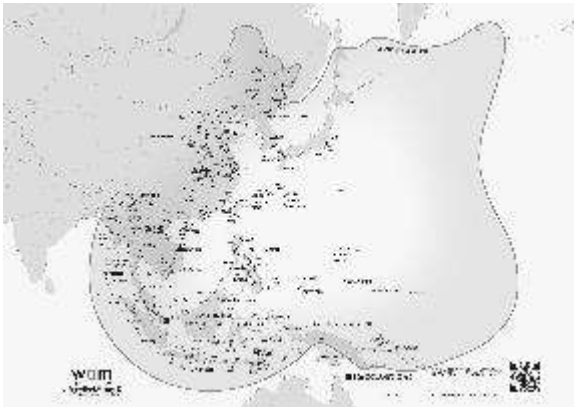
1. Color
